

Abstracts

Authors are invited to submit abstracts by 1st July 2010 for the poster - oral summary presentations, for consideration by the Scientific Committee. In order to highlight the importance of delegates' contributions, the abstracts will be presented in the Workshop's unique format consisting of a poster display, a five minute oral summary and a five minute discussion in an appropriate session. Abstracts should focus broadly on the topics listed in the preliminary programme. The Scientific Committee reserves the right to reject abstracts that do not conform with the following guidelines.

Abstract guidelines:

- Abstract format - see www.nrl.gov.au for an example
- All abstracts must be Microsoft Word files
- Abstracts must fit in the margins:- Top: 2 cm Bottom: 2 cm Left: 2 cm Right: 2 cm Gutter: 0 cm
- Abstracts must be typed in 10 point Arial font
- Abstracts should include an Introduction/Objectives, Methods, Results and Discussion/Conclusion
- Title should be left justified and in upper case. Follow with a single return, then author(s) name(s) in upper and lower case. The name of the author presenting the paper must be underlined
- The line directly after authors should state their organisations' details
- Two single returns to follow then type main body of text ensuring it is fully justified
- Abstracts should be submitted via email as a Microsoft Word attachment, or by mail on a 3.5" IBM high density disk or CD-ROM as a Microsoft Word file, with name and contact details of the presenting author available
- The file name should be the presenter's surname & initial(s) e.g. Pham_TP.doc
- Authors will be advised by email, two weeks after the abstract submission deadline, whether their abstracts have been accepted
